- I. SUPERVISOR SCHEER CALLED THE MEETING TO ORDER AT 6:40 PM.
- II. SUPERVISOR SCHEER, COUNCILMAN TOIGO, COUNCILMAN SORMAN WERE PRESENT, COUNCILMAN NEAR AND COUNCILWOMAN NEAR WERE LATE.
- III. SALUTE TO THE FLAG.
- IV. ON A MOTION BY COUNCILMAN TOIGO SECONDED BY COUNCILWOMAN NEAR AND CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY THE MINUTES OF THE MARCH 10, 2011 TOWN BOARD MEETING WERE ACCEPTED AS PRESENTED.
- V. SUPERVISORS FINANCIAL REPORT- ON A MOTION BY COUNCILMAN SORMAN SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN TOIGO AND CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY THE SUPERVISORS REPORT WAS READ AND FILED. ACCORDING TO THE CENSUS, THERE WAS AN INCREASE IN GALLATIN'S POPULATION BY 169; THIS WILL LEAD TO AN INCREASE IN THE SALES TAX APPORTIONMENT.

  - B. COLUMBIA COUNTY REPORT- THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ACCEPTED THE CENSUS RESULTS. THE COUNTY IS USING NEW SOFTWARE FOR DIRECT DEPOSIT OF PAYROLL. THE LOCAL SHARE FOR DSS IS \$22,000,000.

MUST ALSO BE REVIEWED BY COL CTY PLANNING. IT WILL BE A TYPE 1 ACTION UNDER SEQRA.
