The Highway Department has continued to cut brush and removing dead trees along our town roads. The milder weather has also allowed us to start on ditch work that we normally do in the spring. We have handled several small snow events and haul in sand to mix with our salt for future storms.

Highway Report February 2019

On February 17th Bob Coons demonstrated for a representative from the town board of Taghkanic the advantages of an "Over the Rail Mower". Taghkanic highway department is considering this attachment on there new roadside mowing tractor. During the cold very cold weather we serviced and prepared our tractors for the upcoming season. As temperatures allowed, we continued to remove dead trees from along our roads. We have handled several snow/sleet/ice storms so far this winter.

Highway Report

March/April 2019

I addended a training session at Columbia/Green hosted by Homeland Security and Emergency Services. The training focused on the new requirements for filing FEMA claims. Our Highway crew has continued cutting dead trees and brush along town roads.

We have started our spring sweeping of roads and will continue as weather allows. The winter equipment has been cleaned, painted and is ready for next winter. The Road Salt request for 2019/2020 has been completed so the town can use the state OGS pricing.

The Extreme Winter Recovery has been removed from our CHIPS allocations. Last year that \$18,784.21. I did not get the conformation letter from CHIPS, but I believe we will end up with about \$125,568. These are the purposed road project for 2019.

Camp Road Bridge (between the county road and Beaver road)

Removal of old deck, extending existing abutments, install new precast decking, blacktop on top of decking and approaches and install new guide rails. The bridge would be widen by 4 feet providing safer travel lanes. \$ 105,000

Gallatinville Road: Ditch work,T&L, Improve intersection at Sigler and double chip seal. \$65.000

Olshon Road: Ditch work, T&L, double chip seal

Highway Report

May 2019

The Highway Department has finished it annual sweeping of town roads and continues to do ditch and culvert work along Elson and Gallatinville roads.

On April 25th I had a meeting with the Columbia County's Director of Engineering, Dean Knox, to discuss improvements to the intersection of Sigler and Gallatinville roads. He will provide the town with a design that will allow the town to shut down the northern portion of the current intersection.

Highway Report June 2019

The Highway Department has finished hauling in the stone for our Oil & Stone road toppings projects this summer. We have completed the first round of roadside mowing and continue to do ditch work along Elshon road. The crew attended its annually OSHA training at the Chatham Fair Grounds on June 12th. As requested by the Town Board, the cost of a singal coat of Oil & Stone to a portion of Skiba road (1.30 miles) would be approximately \$29,000. This would bring the total up to 4.5 miles this year.

I am recommending to the Town Board the purchase of a used asphalt roller. The unit is a Hyster 330B 6 ton roller with Tow-Pack for \$5000 + \$900 shipping. Total \$5900.

Highway Report July 2019

The Highway Department has replaced 2 large culverts on Gallatinville and Skiba roads. The crew has continued ditch work throughout the town. Under shared services we were in Ancram with 2 trucks for 2 days. We are going thru the used roller that was approved last month and it will be put in to service shortly.

August/September 2019

As weather allows, we will be doing our oil & stone projects sometime next week. The Camp Road Bridge repair is moving along and it should be reopened by mid-October. The Cemetery has had its annual mowing and we continue on our roadside mowing.
