The Evelyn and Maurice Sharp Gallery features Capturing the Cosmos

Capturing the Cosmos, the 2016 exhibition in the Sharp Family Gallery, explores the influence of the great German Naturalist Alexander von Humboldt on Frederic Church. Acclaimed and revered during his own lifetime, Humboldt is currently enjoying a renaissance due to the recent award-winning bio Invention of Nature by Andrea Wulf, who will be lecturing and writing for the exhibition. Humboldt's writings inspired Church's South American adventures and the resulting masterpieces that made him an internationally famous, and informed Church's later trips to the Bavarian Lakes and Mexico. Sketches, diaries and artifacts from these trips trace Church's daring escapades to capture Humboldt's Cosmos. A portion of the exhibition will be a virtual experience of the 19th century "Great Picture" display of The Heart of the Andes.

About Olana State Historic Site and The Olana Partnership

Olana is the greatest masterpiece of Frederic Edwin Church (1826-1900), the preeminent American artists of the mid-19th century and the most important artist's home, studio and designed landscape in the United States.

Church designed Olana as a holistic environment integrating his advanced ideas about art, architecture, landscape design, and environmental conservation. Olana's 250-acre artist designed landscape with a Persian inspired house at its summit embraces unrivaled panoramic views of the Hudson Valley and Catskill Mountains and, today, welcomes more than 150,000 visitors annually.

Olana State Historic Site, a historic site administered by the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation, Taconic Region, is a designated National Historic Landmark and one of the most visited sites in the state.

The Olana Partnership, a private not-for-profit education corporation, works cooperatively with New York State to support the restoration, conservation, and interpretation of Olana State Historic Site. In 2016, we mark the 50th Anniversary of Olana being saved from destruction.
